- Doesn't need complete sentences
- Doesn't need punctuation or capital letters
- Can use abbreviations or slang

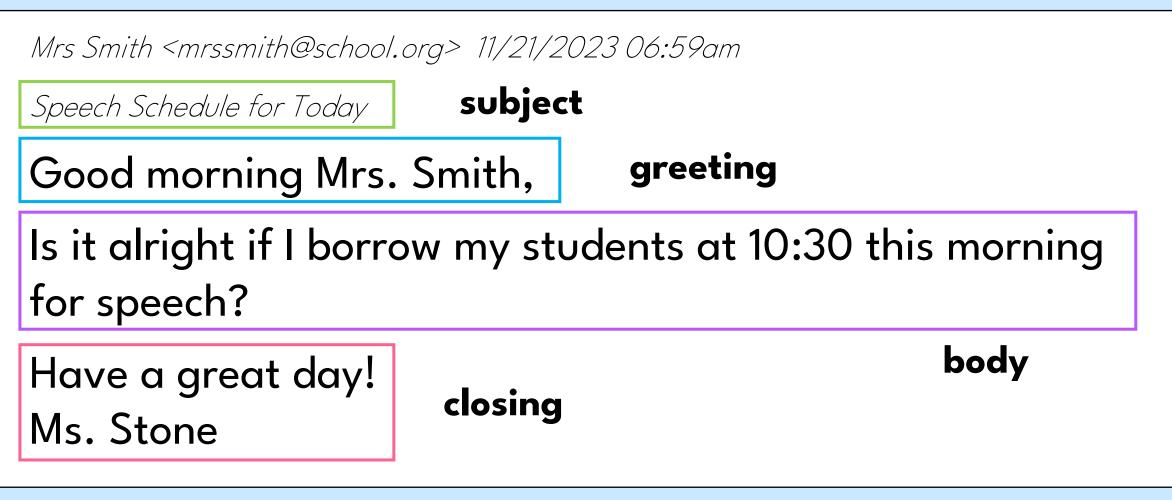

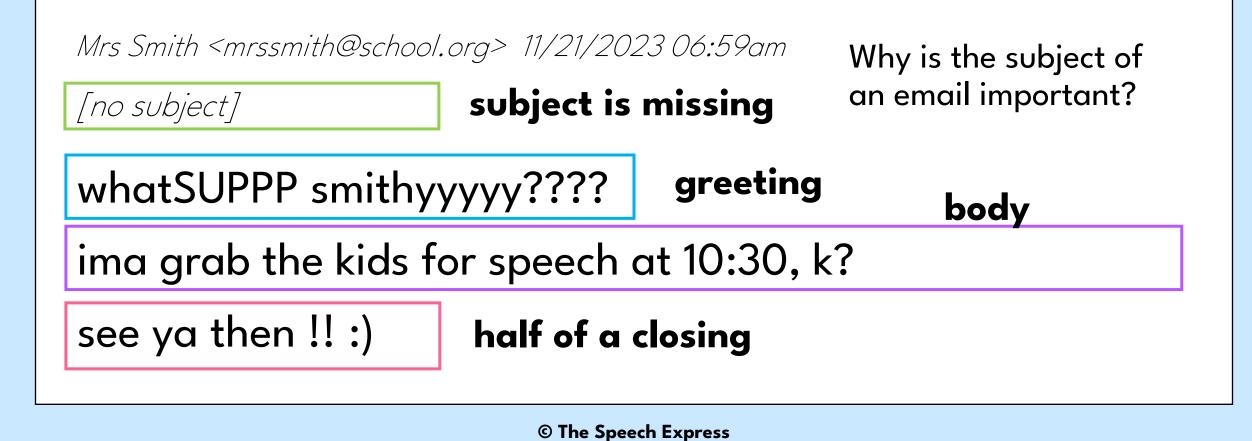
